Locations to be searched:



Organica - 13456 Washington Bl. (also listed as 13458, 13463, and 13468 Washington Bl. in the Cities or Los Angeles and Culver City.); Further described as an off white two story structure with burgundy trim. Burgundy painted numbers approximately 10" reading "13456" are affixed to the front of the building. The business entrance is on the east wall through glass doors with the name "Organica" over the doors.

SEARCH WARRANT AND AFFIDAVIT

For the Following Property:

1 Marijuana, controlled substances under the Uniform Controlled Substance Act, including marijuana,
2 derivatives thereof, and edible products containing marijuana; controlled substances paraphernalia,
3 including equipment used for the cultivation of marijuana (such soil or mediums used for marijuana
4 growing operations), high intensity lights, nutrients, fertilizers, various types of fans, tables, and trays that
5 are specifically designed to facilitate the irrigation of plants, CO2 enrichment systems, electrical timers, and
6 other items that allow for optimum growing conditions), packaging materials such as baggies, bindles and/or
7 equipment, scales, and other instrumentalities of narcotics activities;

9 United States currency; receipts, notes, ledgers, tally sheets, and other papers relating to the cultivation,
10 transportation, ordering, purchasing, and/or distribution of controlled substances or reflecting the proceeds
11 of those activities; records, invoices, records of real estate transactions, bank statements and related bank
12 records, passports, money drafts, money orders, bank drafts, wire transfers, cashier's checks, safe deposit
13 box keys, and other items which demonstrate the obtaining, secreting, transfer, and/or concealment of drug
14 proceeds and any assets derived from drug proceeds;

16 electronic equipment such as telephones, cellular phones, pagers, and telephone answering machines,
17 containing any information regarding the cultivation, transportation, ordering, purchasing, and/or
18 distribution of controlled substances or the proceeds of such activities;

19 photographs, negatives, video tapes, films, undeveloped film, and the contents therein, depicting controlled
20 substances or any entities or individuals involved in the cultivation, transportation, ordering, purchasing,
21 and/or distribution of controlled substances;

22 address and/or telephone books, telephones, pagers, answering machines, customer lists, and any papers
23 reflecting names, addresses, telephone numbers, pager numbers, and/or fax numbers of source(s) of supply
24 or customer(s) of controlled substances;

1 Indicia of occupancy, rental, and/or ownership of the Subject Premises, such as utility and telephone bills,
2 cancelled envelopes, rental, purchase, or lease agreements, and keys;
3 documents and/or notes which purport to be recommendations and/or prescriptions for the use of marijuana;
4 any and all membership records, documents, programs, applications, or materials evidencing the cultivation,
5 possession with intent to distribute, or distribution of marijuana.

6 As used above, the terms records, documents, programs, applications or materials include records,
7 documents, programs, applications or materials created, modified or stored in any form, including records
8 identifying payments for services or expenses, payroll, payroll tax deductions, creditors, suppliers, and
9 correspondence.

11 In searching for data capable of being read, stored or interpreted by a computer, law enforcement personnel
12 executing this search warrant will employ the following procedure: Upon securing the premises, law
13 enforcement personnel trained in searching and seizing computer data (the "computer personnel") will make
14 an initial review of any computer equipment and storage devices (collectively the "computer devices") to
15 determine whether the computer devices can be searched on-site in a reasonable amount of time and without
16 jeopardizing the ability to preserve data contained on the computer devices. If the computer devices can be
17 searched on-site in a reasonable amount of time and without jeopardizing the ability to preserve data, they
18 will be searched on-site, and a computer device will be seized only if the search reveals it to contain any
19 data that falls within the list of items to be seized set forth herein. If the computer devices cannot be
20 searched on-site in a reasonable amount of time and without jeopardizing the ability to preserve data, then
21 the computer personnel will determine whether it is practical to copy the data contained on the computer
22 devices during the execution of the search in a reasonable amount of time without jeopardizing the ability to
23 preserve that data. If it is practical, and the computer devices cannot be searched on site in a reasonable
24 amount of time and without jeopardizing the ability to preserve data, the computer personnel will make a

1 copy of the data contained on each computer device (a "data image") during the execution of this search and

2 shall seize the data images rather than the computer devices themselves. If the computer personnel

3 determine it is not practical to perform an on-site search of the computer devices or make an on-site data

4 image within a reasonable period of time and without jeopardizing the ability to preserve data, then the

5 computer devices will be seized and transported to an appropriate law enforcement laboratory for review.

6 The computer devices will be reviewed by appropriately trained personnel in order to extract and seize any

7 data that falls within the list of items to be seized set forth herein.

8 Additionally, searching officers and or agents assisting in the execution of the service of this affidavit when

9 practicable, in an effort to further the investigation are to answer telephone calls and cellular

10 communications, including instant or text messages.
